

OFF-LICENCE

Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **AFC Longview Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell alcohol on the premises situated at **472 State Highway 1, Otaika, Whangarei**, and known as "**Longview Estate**", to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold on, or delivered from, the premises for consumption off the premises and supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:
Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 5.00pm;
2. No alcohol is to be sold on, or delivered from, the premises on Good Friday, Christmas Day or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day;
3. No alcohol is sold on, or delivered from, the premises at any time on Easter Sunday unless it is grape wine or fruit, or vegetable wine made—
 - a. on the premises; or
 - b. from produce harvested from land on which the premises are situated.
4. While alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, water is to be provided to patrons at no cost from a water supply prominently situated on the premises;
5. The Licensee must have available for purchase on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic beverages.
6. A properly appointed Certificated, or Acting or Temporary, Manager must be on duty, at or nearby the point of sale, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
7. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point-of-sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance to the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty;
8. A remote sale of alcohol may be made at any time, on any day. Any alcohol sold by remote sale must not be delivered at any time between 11pm and 6am the next day;
9. For any remote sale, the licensee must comply with the requirements in the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Regulations 2013 for signage, and to ensure that the purchaser is not a minor.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The sale, supply or consumption of alcohol is authorised in the premises situated at 472 State Highway 1, Otaika, Whangarei is more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Whangarei District Licensing Committee on 7 August 2023.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S


A copy of this licence must be attached to the inside of the premises concerned so as to be easily read by people entering the principal entrance to the premises. The front door is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

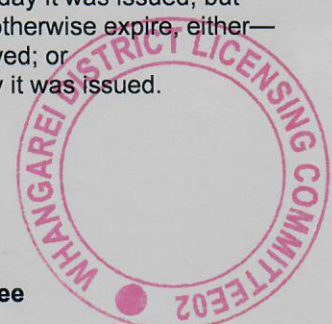
Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force -

- (a) either—
 - (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
 - (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
